

Rare breeding birds in the United Kingdom in 2017

The following updates to the published species accounts reflect additional data and corrections which came to our attention after publication of the 2017 RBBP report in *British Birds* 112: 706-758 (December 2019). This update includes all known amendments up to **23rd March 2020**.

Common Pochard *Aythya ferina*

Revised totals: **191 sites: 431–756 pairs**. 5-yr mean now 723 bp.

Amended county totals as follows:

Northern Ireland

Co. Armagh No. sites: 5; Confirmed pairs: 12; Total pairs: 13.

Little Egret *Egretta garzetta*

Additional counts received subsequent to publication of the 2017 report, for five sites across three counties (Dorset, Essex and Norfolk, documented in the report amendment files for the appropriate years), mean that the 5-yr mean is now 1,155 bp.

Mediterranean Gull *Ichthyaetus melanocephalus*

Revised totals: **53 sites: 1,398–1,428 pairs**.

Peregrine Falcon *Falco peregrinus*

Revised totals: **850–1,104 pairs**.

Willow Tit *Poecile montanus*

Revised totals: **255–730 pairs**.
